Introducing:
2009 Battle of I-75

- Program is designed to teach advanced football skills; enhance athletic and character development; while competing in a spirited league environment
- For boys in grades 5 & 6/12U, no weight limits
- Season runs from January 5 – March 13, 2009 (10 weeks)
- Schedule includes one practice, one scrimmage game, six regular season games, and two playoff games at an indoor facility (60 minutes each session)
- Individual teams up to thirteen players, games are 7 on 7 (centers are required, but do not go out for passes)
- Two to three practices per week for first two weeks, at least one practice per week for last eight weeks (teams may practice more)
- Coaches are responsible to reserve practice locations (all practice facility fees are paid by the team), two hour practice goal
- Suggested practice schedules and diagrams are provided
- Sample offensive and defensive playbooks are provided
- All games are played at indoor soccer facilities on Fridays at 7:00-8:00, 8:00-9:00, or 9:-10:00 pm, games are played for 50 minutes
- Facilities are located along I-75 South, from Franklin to Cincinnati, Ohio
- All games are officiated by two paid referees
- No pads or equipment, semi-contact (upper body-open hands), mouthpieces required, flag tackling
- A general list of rules are provided, also requires that all rostered players play in a starting position on at least one side of the ball for the entire game, otherwise OHSAA game rules apply
- Cost is \$1,200 per team (or \$125 per player, individuals will be assigned to teams where team sizes allow)
- Fees includes: AAU memberships, game jerseys, mouthpieces, coaches shirts, team flags, team footballs, referee fees, 10 weeks of indoor game facility usage (ten 60 minute sessions), and season ending program pizza celebration with player recognition
- **Note:** Teams may enlist a sponsor to pay fees; jerseys and coaches shirts may coordinate with sponsor color and logo.
- Voluntary weekly participation in team and individual character development workbook (homework pages) w/participant reward program, and pre-game prayer
- Team reservations are first-come first serve, October 31, 2008 deadline
- Recommended for coaches to attend three preseason training meetings in December and January, dates TBA
- Kingdom Football Ministries will co-sponsor the league and have two to four teams in the league.
